

I am Shunsuke Matsumoto from Information and Media Studies at Sagami Women's University. The subjects I teach are about the connections of media and social rules. I focus on learning about laws for information society, especially discovering legal problems and legal problem-solving. Media students can study Media Environment Theory I-III, Information Management Theory, and Information Environment Theory, but the basic rules all come from the university-wide course, Japanese Constitutional Law. In modern civil society, individuals' rights and freedoms are recognized, but our environment has

changed since they were established. In particular, in our society experiencing the Information Revolution, it is difficult to distinguish what rules should remain and what new rules are needed. My demonstration class for Open Campus is "Fearful Stories about Personal Information." Personal information is important, but if we are not careful, it can be misused in our information society. Please come and experience this class, where we will look at some actual case studies.

- 6. Please give a message for students who are not enrolled at this university. SWU Media students are not only creating but also learning many things. If you interested in SWU, please experience our Open Campus.


